DYSPHAGIA

POLICY:

To ensure that the proper diet is provided for the resident who is having difficulty swallowing or exhibiting signs of choking while eating.

PROCEDURE:

- When the Registered Staff observe that a resident is experiencing difficulty swallowing at mealtimes, a temporary intervention on the resident's behalf will be made to prevent any further complications. The interventions may include: change in texture, thickened fluids and supervision during meals.
- 2. The Registered Staff will then complete a dietary requisition and forward it to the Dietary Supervisor for the Dietitian to assess the resident's needs. Further interventions will be implemented as recommended by the Dietitian.
- 3. The Dietitian will put the recommendations in the Doctor's book for the Physician to change the diet order.
- 4. The Dietitian will update the plan of care and document in the multidisciplinary notes.
- 5. The Dietary Supervisor will inform the dietary staff of any necessary changes.
- 6. The Dietary Supervisor will update the resident's family with any changes to the resident's diet.
- 7. When further interventions as required, such as the possibility of enteral feeding, the multidisciplinary team will discuss the options with the resident and family.
- 8. The multidisciplinary team will ensure that the resident and family are aware of all advantages and/or disadvantages of enteral feeding.
- 9. The wishes of the resident and family must be respected at all times.
