# 24-HOUR NURSING RISK MANAGEMENT REPORT

## POLICY:

All clinical and organizational risks will be monitored and reported in each 24-hour period.

### PROCEDURE:

Key themes to monitor and address include but are not limited to:

- Census move ins, transfers, discharges, hospitalizations, return from hospital, deaths.
- Changes in health status related to falls, skin integrity, new infections, behavioural issues, weight changes, application or removal of restraints.
- Family/resident concerns.
- Incidents i.e. resident, staff, sentinel or adverse events, outbreaks.
- Staffing patterns, supplies, administration issues.

The ADOC / Nurse in charge or designate will:

- 1) Initiate the 24-Hour Nursing Risk Management report at start of shift each day.
- 2) Refer to the guidelines outlined in the report to identify any areas of potential or actual risk.
- 3) View the clinical documentation system's Shift report for all Resident Home Areas/Neighbourhoods, making note of high risk issues and documenting pertinent issues on the 24-Hour Nursing Risk Management report.
- 4) During rounds on all home areas/neighbourhoods, obtain report from the oncoming RN/RPN/LPN and make notation of areas of risk on the report.
- 5) Follow up on previously identified risk issues with RN/RPN/LPN assigned to home area/neighbourhood to determine follow up by home area/neighbourhood team.
- 6) Submit the previous 24-Hour Nursing Risk Management Report to the DOC for review and provide an update on all relevant items.

The Director of Care will:

- Assign the task of completion of the 24-Hour Nursing Risk Management Report either by Home, by home area/neighbourhood, by floor, or by building to an ADOC or Nurse in charge.
- 2) Review the 24-Hour Nursing Risk Management Report with the ADOC/designate.

3) Identify trends/patterns of potential risk and take corrective action.
