BEHAVIOUR INTERVENTIONS

POLICY:

To manage individual behaviours with appropriate interventions. To recognize and manage or prevent inappropriate behaviour.

PROCEDURE:

- Registered Staff and PSW's recognize and identify inappropriate behaviour.
- Report to the Registered Staff if first time occurrence
- Consult the incidental and predictable behaviour flow sheets for previous behaviour occurrence.
- Consult narrative portion of care plan for intervention on previous occurrence.
- Implement intervention as indicated on the behaviour flow sheets.
- Assess and document outcome and time spent.
- Registered Staff will need to contact the Physician if further interventions are required.
- Involve the family where possible. Ask family to sit or comfort resident if staff is not able to do so. Keep family updated on the resident's condition.
